Primary Curriculum

At Richard Barnes Academy we aim to have the child at the heart of everything we do, offering both them and their families a fresh start and an opportunity to re-engage with learning in a supportive, inclusive environment.

We offer flexible learning through vibrant, enriching life and learning experiences with a unique curriculum. This ambitious curriculum caters for the individual needs of every child in a therapeutic, nurturing environment with professional support.

Our focus on social and emotional development helps our students become confident, resilient, independent people, who aspire to succeed as citizens of the world. Through mutual trust, respect, and the development of positive relationships, we hope to instil empathy, compassion and kindness - while valuing diversity. This is embedded in all aspects of school life.

We are proud to offer an individualised curriculum, which matches the needs of each student and where they are in their personal learning journey. We offer a core curriculum which is thematic where possible, with opportunities for outdoor learning also on offer. Our curriculum focuses on developing individual learning behaviours, to ensure the best possible outcomes for our Primary students.





Secondary Curriculum

Every child at Richard Barnes Academy has been on a unique educational journey. We are committed to returning our students to mainstream school, moving them onto specialist provision, or positively transitioning them to post-16 education, employment or training.

Students are therefore with us for varying amounts of time, some individuals will have a very short time on our roll while others will remain with us until the end of their primary years or Year 11. Due to this, our curriculum offer needs to be flexible, personalised, and designed to allow students to progress to the next stage on their educational journey.

Our curriculum is designed to be broad, flexible, rigorous, relevant, ambitious, exciting, engaging and fun, with the hope that we can 'ignite a spark' in our learners that could become a passion and lead on to a career.

We aim to provide:

- A knowledge-engaged* curriculum which re-ignites the students with learning, using current research and knowledge of their individual needs.
- A curriculum that will enrich and empower students to access the next stage of their education, be responsible citizens and aspirational in their life and career choices.
- A thirst for learning within our school culture, where school is unmissable because of the tailored educational offer.

At Key Stage Three, students will be provided with a curriculum offer which generally aligns with the National Curriculum.

At Key Stage Four, students study our main core subjects - Maths, English, Science, Home Cooking, RSHE and PE - but also have the opportunity to study options subjects as well as a range of vocational qualifications.

^{*}knowledge-engaged refers to a curriculum that values both knowledge and skill, as opposed to a solely knowledge-led or skills-led curriculum.





SEND

At Richard Barnes Academy, we believe everyone can acquire the belief, opportunities and skills they need to succeed, and we provide a high level of SEND support to those who need it.

All learners are assessed on entry to Richard Barnes Academy to identify strengths and specific needs. Parents and carers are involved in these discussions and will remain in close contact with the school throughout. Our SEND team will ensure that staff are fully informed of the individual needs of our learners and will advise on the best practices to remove barriers to learning for each individual.

Teaching is responsive to different learning styles and allows for meaningful and effective education, and inclusion for all.

Learners will have access to a range of support services.



Eating and drinking All learners are provided with a free healthy meal every day. They will be offered a choice of a hot meal or baguette, with vegetarian options, plus a salad bar and dessert.



Forest School Learners can take part in Forest School, an outdoor education programme which supports play, exploration, and supported risk-taking through practical experiences in natural settings.



Mental health and wellbeing We prioritise mental health and learners will be actively encouraged to talk about their feelings, helping them think about things differently and release tension. Our onsite school counsellor provides emotional support and helps learners build resilience.




E-Safety The internet is an integral part of children and young people's lives. Online safety skills are extremely important and all our learners are regularly educated in staying safe online.




Emotional Literacy Support Our Emotional Literacy Support Assistant (ELSA), supports learners with emotional needs including loss and bereavement, anxiety, friendship skills and personal resilience. ELSA programmes run for 6-12 weeks, with fun and engaging tailored sessions.





Careers Programme



Understanding our learners' career choices and aspirations is paramount to their achievement at school and future success.

At Richard Barnes Academy we are committed to embedding aspirations for future careers throughout all aspects of our learners' school lives. We are devoted to making sure that all learners have an appropriate and sustainable post-16 destination that is tracked and supported.
